Ruthless Romans	English	This term pupils will be building on their understanding of Pompeii and its representation as a Roman city. They will explore the language used in the text and write an eye witness recount of the eruption of Mount Vesuvius, as well as a non-chronological report. Later they will design a holdiay brochure persuading readers to visit Pompeii.
	Maths	This term pupils will develop their understanding of length and perimeter, fractions with a focus on adding and subtracting fractions and finding fractions of a quantity. They will also measure and compare mass and capacity, as well as understanding which is most appropriate to use.
	History	This term, students will gain a deeper understanding of an extended chronological study. Pupils will look at the legacy of the Roman Empire and what is was like in the Roman era.
	Art/DT	The children will learn how to design and create a Roman tunic. They will be developing their joining and stitching skills when designing, creating and evaluating their finished product.
	Music	For the Romans topic, the children will be looking at Ancient Roman instruments and comparing them to instruments they know today. They will learn some fun songs about the Romans and consider techniques for singing including posture and breathing.
	Computing	We will be working with iPads to develop our coding skills to write successful algorithms using Swift Playgrounds 1.
	R.E.	This term children will learning about different faiths and how they pray.
	P.E.	This term we are focusing on dance using our topic of the Romans to develep agility, balance, co-ordination and precision. We will also be developing our hand-eye co-ordination skills and using overarm to throw accurately.
	Personal Development	This term the pupils will focus on their understanding of how the interenet is used for assessing information online.
