Visionary Victorians

Big Bang

Children will spend an interactive day immersing themselves into the Victorian era and what life was like then.

Pride Time

Pupils will be creating portraits of famous Victorian figures.

Learning Outside of the Classroom

Children will be going to the London Museum Docklands to experience a day as a Victorian Child. They will also be going to the Museum of Childhood to experience the types of toys children would have played with.

Visionary Victorians

English

In English we will be looking at how to write a biography and then using what we have learnt to write a biography of Queen Victoria. We will use the text *Oliver Twist* to write a story set in the Victorian era.

Maths

This term pupils will be continuing to develop our knowledge of multiplication and division as well as mass and fractions. They will also continue to develop their understanding of times tables.

Science

Science this term will focus on electricity. We will be looking at appliances that rely on electricity and how it flows through circuits.

History

We will explore Queen Victoria's impact on British history, focusing on social changes and the Victorian era as a key turning point.

Art/DT

In this unit, children will enhance their drawing skills by exploring light, shading, and tone, culminating in a portrait of Queen Victoria. They will study facial features, experiment with pencil grades, and focus on capturing expression in their artwork.

Music

We will be revisiting glockenspiels, but this time the focus will be learning notes on the staff. This will be consolidating their learning on the glockenspiels and understanding standard music notation.

Computing

We will be using Osmo Coding Awbie skills while using UDL principles to support diverse learners through problem-solving, creativity, and iterative coding improvement.

R.E.

This term the focus is Christianity. Our key question will be: What does it mean to be a Christian in Britain today? Pupils will look into rules and religious practices of Christianity and the importance of the bible.

P.E.

Next term in PE, we will be learning gymnastics, focusing on symmetry and asymmetry (patterns), as well as athletics.
